- Serial Control



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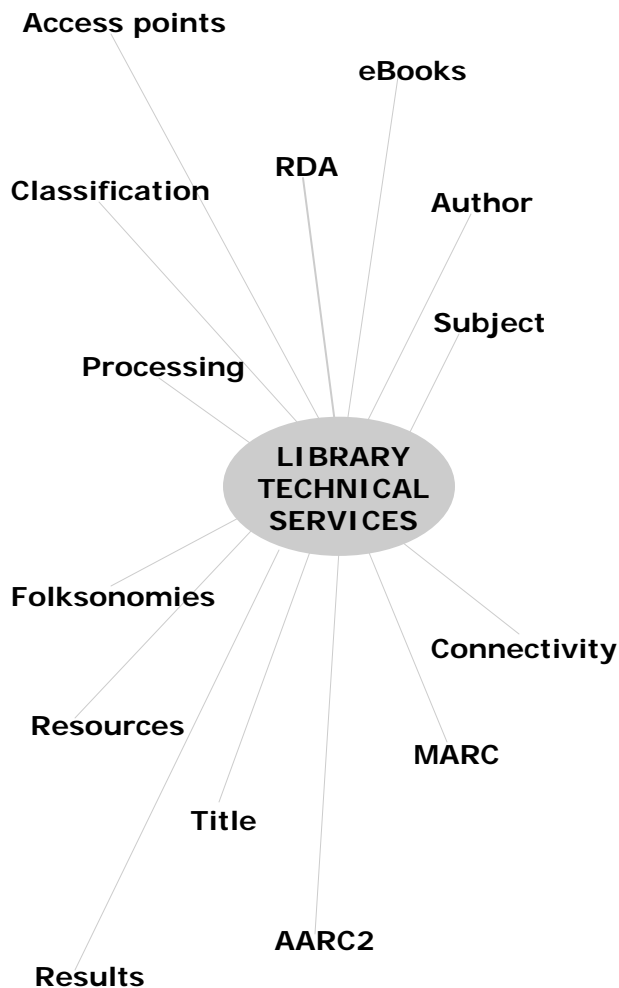

Who Works in Technical Services... and What Do They Do?



We are librarians, administrators and supervisors, often managing large units.

We are also para-professionals and support staff with various levels of skills and training, working together to benefit our libraries and communities.

We work with metadata and are continuously evaluating the means and methods available to provide cutting edge access to information, world-wide.

Some of us are information specialists in collection development.

We are responsible for ordering, receiving, cataloging and processing all new library materials, which include print, audio, video, software, CD-ROMs, games, downloadable formats and electronic resources.

We are negotiators. The ordering and receiving process requires communication or negotiating with vendors on a variety of levels.

Some of us are webmasters, bloggers, or Internet Gurus, and others expand horizons into virtual libraries.

We catalog and classify the items aiming for logic and specificity in arrangement of the materials in our collections.

We are specialists in organization of information.

Some of us work directly with the public, while others serve behind the scenes.

We are into "item management" as we describe items in bibliographic records, providing numerous access points for more productive search results, adding information for keyword or touchpoint interaction.

Some of us have been elected to positions in national or state organizations.

We prepare and package items for use by members and staff, with careful consideration given to cost, preventative maintenance, and item identification.

We are preservationists who work to preserve, repair, or restore items that are irreplaceable.

We maintain the integrity of holdings databases and the condition of our collections.
